Community Dog Waste Removal

Fairfax County has decided to enforce its own rule of not picking up large amounts of dog waste so the Association has hired TruGreen to come on Tuesday or Thursday each week to remove and replace bags in the two dog waste stations and the trash can at the tennis courts and the two tot lots. Those trash cans have "baggies" dumped in them too. If the can or waste station near you isn't emptied, please let the Board know.

FIOS Update

We have hit a snag with the installation of FIOS on upper Ridge View, Marjoram, Evergreen Knoll and Medallion. Although LRHOA Board signed Verizon's document that allowed them to install FIOS in those areas, further research reveals that the Builder of our Community never filed a utility easement for those streets.

LRHOA Board does not have sole authority to grant any easement on common ground. Our governing documents require a 100% notarized vote of all 284 owners, which is an insurmountable task. The only hope is for 75% of homeowners to agree to amend our documents. There are other needed amendments so if you would like to work on a Committee to address all these amendments, please contact the Board.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

New **towing signs** are posted throughout the Community. Henry's Towing has been given authority to tow, without notice, any vehicle double-parked or parked in front of a fire lane. The fire lanes are painted yellow and have signs posted.

Aeration and overseeding were done in late October, irrigation systems winterized and trees assessed for pruning or removal. A second common area leaf removal will occur in December, as well as mulching and fertilization. The contract for snow plowing and sanding was renewed; Management and Grounds Maintenance contracts will be renewed by year's end. The audit was completed and there were no issues. The Board is seeking bids for fire lane painting and sidewalk repairs.

Fire Safety and Your Tree

- Keep tree base immersed in water
- No smoking near the tree
- Use only U.L. approved lights
- Use flame retardant decorations/paper
- Inspect lights for frayed or cracked wiring, broken plugs, and defective sockets
- Unplug lights at night or when leaving home
- Remove the tree before needles dry out



Stream Stabilization **Project Update**

The County contractor has returned and planted shrubs and trees around the "stepping stone" area and removed the trees they cut down. The remaining black plastic will be removed next Spring after that area has stabilized.

Old Man Winter's Arrival Means Shoveling Snow

When it snows, it is your responsibility to shovel the snow from your porch/stoop, walkway and the sidewalk in front of your residence. Salt and chemical treatments can damage your sidewalks and plants, so if shoveling isn't enough, use <u>sand or non-clumping kitty litter</u> to help decrease the likelihood of slipping or falling.

When you shovel your numbered parking space, please <u>don't throw snow onto the street</u>. When the snowplow comes through, it will push that snow behind rows of cars where it could freeze into large chunks overnight. Frozen and packed snow takes longer to melt. If you shovel snow from an unnumbered space, that doesn't stake a claim but common courtesy is <u>not to park in a space that you didn't clear</u>.

When the snow melts from the streets, it flows toward the <u>storm drains</u>. If there is one near your home, shovel the snow so the drain is exposed.

And someone needs to insure that the mailman has access to the mailboxes or he can't deliver.

Please <u>bring in your trash and recycle cans</u> as soon as possible. They can get frozen into the snow and/or ice if the weather turns bad. And speaking of <u>trash</u>, <u>please don't put it out early!</u> The pickup dates don't change and those that live near the "collection" points shouldn't have to work around your trash to shovel out. The snow plow drivers plow around trash cans and Fairfax County may not pick up trash if the weather is severe.



History of Daylight Savings Time

The idea was first conceived by Benjamin Franklin in 1784. The main purpose of DST is to make better use of daylight. We change our clocks during the summer months to move an hour of daylight from the morning to the evening. Daylight Savings Time also saves energy. DST "makes" the sun set one hour later which reduces the period between sunset and bedtime by one hour so less electricity is needed for lighting and appliances late in the day.

Keep Your Pets Safe and Warm

Please remember to watch your pets carefully in the winter months. Just because they have fur coats does not mean they are comfortable outside for long periods of time. Whether you have dogs or cats, be sure they stay as warm and comfortable as you are. Bring them in to enjoy the warmth. CONSTRUCTION

Area Road Construction

<u>Mulligan Road</u>. Located on Telegraph Road, midway between Hayfield Rd and Beulah St, it will provide access to Route 1. Phase 2 is underway and when completed Mulligan Road will feature four lanes and appropriate turn lanes, wide curb lanes to accommodate bicycles, raised curbed medians, and 5-foot sidewalks on each side. Anticipated completion is Summer of 2014.

<u>Telegraph Road from South Van Dorn to North Kings Highway.</u> Utilities to be relocated include a water main, sewer and gas lines along with overhead power lines. Current completion date of November 2014 features a raised median, two striped 4-ft wide bike lanes, and a wide sidewalk on each side of Telegraph. The project will reconstruct Huntley Meadows Park entrance and parking lot on South Kings Highway to provide safer access.

Telegraph Road between Beulah St and Hayfield Rd. By November 2014 we should see a raised overpass near the Kingstowne Fire Station, four travel lanes and appropriate turn lanes, two striped 4-ft wide bike lanes, raised curbed medians and landscaping.

Farmers Almanac Says....

Virginia is in the cold, wet and white zone. First ten days of February could bring heavy winter weather. Almanac looks for a mid-March wave of storminess coast-to-coast bringing a variety of precipitation types including strong and gusty winds.

You may want to reread last issue's "Time to Prepare for Old Man Winter" and if you haven't bought a snow shovel and non-clumping kitty litter for your trunk, better beat the rush. Also, you need to be prepared for power outages – heavy snow or ice on power lines could mean downed power lines.

Inside Winter Preparation

- Turn off your attic fan
- Replace your furnace filter (monthly)
- Move the air flow "arm" in your furnace duct from summer side to winter side
- Reverse ceiling fan blades
- Check for ill-fitting windows and doors
- Put tape over unused wall outlets on outside walls
- Locate your snow shovel
- Check your flashlight for batteries
- Ensure you have plenty of water and nonperishable food in case of power outages

Safety Tips for Removing Snow and/or Ice from Your Vehicle

Clear all the snow from the hood, roof and windows of your vehicle. You need a lot more visibility in the winter to avoid other drivers who may not be as careful as you, so be sure to clear the entire windshield not just a peephole.

Clean the snow off the headlights and taillights so others can see you. Don't forget the side mirrors.

Remember to stay further back than usual from the vehicle in front of you. If that driver didn't clear the

snow off the roof, it may slide or blow onto your hood or windshield and impede your view. Or that driver could suddenly lose control on the packed snow or ice and you need to be able to "get out of the way."

If your vehicle is "iced over" the above applies except for clearing the ice from the hood and roof.
