Warmest Greetings of the Season

Christmas Tree Pickup

UNDECORATED Christmas trees will be picked up with trash **ONLY** January 4 and 11. Please do **NOT** dispose of the trees in the woods.



Feeding the Wildlife

Please don't put out food for animals. They are searching more actively in winter but they could end up inside your home or take up residence in your rear yard.

Snow Plowing & Sand

Snow plowing will occur at 3" and sand will be spread as needed.

Keep It Cleared

Don't block the mailbox area with your garbage/recycle cans.

When It Snows....

Keep the snow cleared in front of your **storm door** to make sure you are able to open it.

Snow Shovel Storage

Please do not store your snow shovel on the front porch. Sometimes it "grows legs and walks off." Then what do you do the next time it snows? And it's so out of place in the Spring when it doesn't get put away.

News from the Board

Welcome to Chris Payne and Drew Lucio who were appointed to the Board.

Contracts were renewed for **Management**, **snow removal** and **Grounds**. **Irrigation** systems were winterized. **Benches** were installed on EGK and Lofthill.

Aereation, overseeding and one **leaf removal** were done in November. A second common area **leaf removal** will occur in December, as well as **mulching and fertilization.** The **audit** was completed with no issues. Fall **tree assessment** was performed.

Animals, Birds and Your Trash

Food is scarce in the winter. **Please** don't set your trash out early or in white trash bags. Once animals/birds find your "trash deposit spot" has bags they can chew into, they will return (not just on trash day). *Be considerate of your neighbors and the appearance of our Community*, and place your trash out in cans or heavy-weight black bags after 5pm on Tuesday.

And if you are one of those who is using a recycle bin, rather than the blue can, remember that any food or liquid left in your cans and bottles is an attractive nuisance to animals who might carry disease. Pizza boxes have food residue and are not recyclable but they are tasty!!



2016 Bluebird Box Wrap-Up

The 4th year of monitoring bluebird nest boxes as part of the Virginia Bluebird Trail has come to a close. Bluebirds aren't always early or aggressive enough to establish nests in these boxes, and throughout the spring and summer, several other species may also use them to nest. This season, our boxes have been dominated by House Wrens, a small, native, rather gregarious songbird with a beautiful voice. Across all boxes, we had 27 House Wrens and 13 Carolina Chickadees successfully fledge (be raised to adulthood and left the nest box). These numbers get reported to the Virginia Bluebird Society each year to help with overall tracking of trends of native bird populations. We hope the bluebirds seen by the tennis courts will scope out those newly installed boxes and nest next spring!

Crabgrass Preventer

Crabgrass seeds can germinate each year when nighttime soil temperatures reach over 50 degrees for 3 days. This "wakes up" the seed and starts the process of becoming your worst nightmare. The best time to apply the pre-emergent would be between mid-February through the end of March or while forsythia is in full bloom.

Neighborhood Tidbits

- Keep your porch light to make it easier for dogwalkers to see and vehicle vandals prefer dark cars.
- Street light out or malfunctioning? Call or email our management with pole number and nearest address.



Fairfax Alerts System



For those of you who like to be more connected about things like severe weather warnings, bad traffic, government closings, etc.
www.fairfaxcounty.gov/alerts will allow you to customize which alerts you want to receive.
You can set up locations you're most interested in getting alerts about (e.g. home, school, work) and you can indicate your method of communication (e.g. email, text). Set up is free and takes just a couple of minutes to customize.

Those Pesky Potholes

Cracks in pavement are caused by vehicle weight and temperature changes. When water gets into a road crack and freezes, the crack enlarges and eventually weakens the asphalt. Continual road traffic over this weakened area leaves a jagged hole, typically the size of a grapefruit.

The best way to avoid "calamities" when driving is to avoid those potholes. If you hit a pothole and your vehicle is damaged, you can submit a damage claim to Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT). Each claim will be investigated as to the circumstances, type and location of the pothole, whether VDOT had been notified of its existence, and if VDOT had been given a reasonable amount of time for repairs. To report a pothole or check on damage claim, call VDOT at 1-800-367-6723 (1-800-FOR-ROAD).

Fairfax County has 85 miles of interstate, 180 miles of primary roads and 1700 miles of secondary roads. It's anyone's guess how many potholes there are!!

And why is VDOT responsible for the roads in Fairfax County? In 1932 all counties in Virginia were given the option of maintaining their roads or turning that responsibility over to VDOT. After evaluating the cost and effect on taxes, only Arlington and Henrico counties chose to shoulder road maintenance. Aren't you glad?

Winter 2015 – 2016 Memories

Snowzilla tied for 4th place in snowfall records with 17.8 inches January 22-23. We all shoveled more snow than that though.

And that followed a December that:

- had no snow for the first time since 2001
- set two 71 degree records
- had 26 days hotter than 50, most since 1889
- had 14 days above 60, beating 1971 record
- featured 4.84" of rain, wettest since 5.53" in 2013

And the month was second warmest of the 21st century, just short of 2012.

2016-2017 winter is forecasted to be colder than normal with 16-20" of snow coming in smaller storms.

Snow and Your Trash Can

This time of year it is more important to have your cans out for as short a time as possible. Out after 5 Tuesday and in by dark Wednesday. They can freeze in place, making it difficult to move, and the snowplow has to maneuver around them.

Remember if weather is severe, the County trucks may not collect on schedule but assume they will.

And When It Snows

You are responsible for shoveling your porch/stoop, walkway and the sidewalk in front of your home as well as your numbered parking space. Shoveling snow from an unnumbered space doesn't mean you staked a claim but common courtesy is if you didn't clear the space, don't park in it.

Do Your Kids Eat Snow?

Some studies cite that as a bad idea. As the snow falls, it acts like a sponge, removing several chemicals from the air. Some of these chemicals can damage the central nervous system, are associated with breathing difficulties, kidney failure or neurological problems.

And if your neighbor's dog has "relieved itself" in a lower layer of snow, that could be scooped up in a handful of snow too.

Snow On Your Car

When clearing the snow, please remember your roof. The snow blowing from a rooftop can be blinding to the car behind you. And those lights and license plates need to be visible too.

Check your gas tank level often and make sure your windshield washer tank is full.

Shoveling Courtesy

Don't throw snow into the street or push it in front of islands. It will freeze, turn to ice and when the plow returns, the snow will end up behind vehicles again.

Ensure the mailman can get safely to the mailboxes, that storm drains are open to allow faster exit of melting snow and fire hydrants need to be exposed. Don't forget access to the pet waste stations. And if those are full, please take your doggie bags home - - when the lid won't close due to overload, a health hazard is created and an attraction for some wild animals will exist.

Winter Tips

- Gently rub a small, moistened cloth bag of iodized salt on the outside of windshield to prevent ice and snow from sticking.
- Stuck on ice without sand or kitty litter? Use your car mats to get traction.
- Have hanging icicles? Tap them with a broom, from a window if possible.
- Candles in glass containers can burn out and since it's hot, may burn the table where it sits.
