

Board Seat Vacancies

The business decisions affecting Loft Ridge are made by a Board of Directors. There are no specific requirements to be a member and amount of time devoted depends on your level/areas of interest. At Board meetings, Directors must be civil, productive, respectful and stay on point. Whatever the outcome of a vote, the entire Board must stand behind it. Board members must consider the Community as a whole and not have a specific agenda. This criteria is a must and we are interested in candidates who fit that bill.

There is a monthly packet mailed to each Director, to be pre-read. You will have input in creating a budget, make decisions regarding issues of non-compliance and ACC violations, review contracts and delinquencies, generate Resolutions and oversee our Committees.

Seven of your neighbors comprise the Board. There will be two open seats this spring. If you would like to be a candidate, consider attending the March, April, and/or May Board meetings to see what's involved.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting May 28, 2014.

FIOS in 2014 – For Some

The Verizon contractor has set flags along Ridge View to the upper end. They will dig the ditches and lay the fiber optic cable inside orange PVC to protect it from the elements. Verizon will then schedule the "splicers" (probably in 3rd to 4th quarter of this year) who will check the cable before authorizing neighbor commitment. Once splicers approve, installers can then run the wiring from the connectors into your home.

News From The Board

A contract was awarded to LMK Web Design for the redesign of our website. Goal is to have it "up and running" by the Annual Meeting. Responses to the recent survey were useful in determining content. No Trespassing signs have been ordered for the tot lots and the "big field" on Cannon. Waste stations/trash cans will be emptied on Tuesdays. Creation of a draft budget for FY15 is underway. The County has agreed to unclog the stream under the dip on Ridge View.

Grounds Contract Summary

- Spring: Clean-up (removal of debris accumulated over the winter) Edging of plant beds Mulching with shredded hardwood Fertilization of trees and shrubs Turf fertilizations Pre-Emergent and post-emergent weed control Annuals in entrance beds Summer: -Ongoing: -Mowing April 1 – November 15 every 7-10 days to a height of 3-4" Edging April 1 – November with every other mowing Weed control in beds and on hard surfaces -Removal of tree suckers and low hanging branches Mulching with shredded hardwood Fall: Pansies in entrance beds _ Turf fertilizations Turf aeration, liming and over seeding Post-emergent weed control -- Leaf removals
 - Necessary pruning of trees less than 12'
 - **Time TBD:** Pruning shrubbery, 2-3 times
 - Perennial cut back
 - Ground cover pruning, max 5 times

- Special pick-up items can be scheduled by going to https://specialpickup.fairfaxcounty.gov or by calling (703) 802-3322. Set items in an area distant from regular trash. Trees and light poles interfere with "grab arms" of equipment.

Is That Dog Poop Yours?

Lately some dog walkers have been allowing their dogs to "leave a present" on our grass, our sidewalks, and in some cases in yards!! This is not only unsightly but it's unsanitary. Would you like to step in one of those piles and have to clean off your carpet, shoes, or car flooring? Please, if you see someone not cleaning up after his/her pet, remind him or her Fairfax County has a "Scoop the Poop" law! If you know the owner's address, contact the Board or Management and they will be sent a warning letter.

Some homeowners in the single family houses around us walk their dogs in our Community. Not using bags has suddenly become a problem and it's doubtful that only the non-residents are guilty.

Updated Noise Ordinance

On December 3, Fairfax County of Supervisors adopted a law to limit nuisance noise. The law bars noises that can be heard inside a home when the doors and windows are closed, including loud music, yelling and barking dogs. In addition, use of a loudspeaker or amplifier outside between 11pm and 7am is prohibited. Police non-emergency number is 703-691-2131.

What is the Architectural Control Committee?

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) is mandated by our governing documents. The Committee's main responsibility is to insure that any exterior changes are approved before being done and are in compliance with the Guidelines. In the Spring, Committee members inspect all townhouses and note any unapproved changes from original condition or color. Maintenance issues are also noted. Homeowners are notified in writing of anything observed that is not in compliance and given ninety days to correct the maintenance issues and/or request approval of unapproved changes. A re-inspection is completed at that time and the Board is advised on non-compliant homeowners.

The ACC's intention is to ensure we continue to live in an attractive and well-maintained Community. Owners were provided a copy of the governing documents and Guidelines, contained in the Handbook, at time of purchase.

The Committee recommends Guideline changes to the Board, usually based on several homeowners suggesting them or to comply with a new law. When approved, the updates are mailed to each homeowner and also posted on the Loft Ridge website.

Different Liability for Credit and Debit Cards

Credit cards are covered by the Truth in Lending Act, which places the maximum liability for fraudulent charges at \$50. The law offers dispute protection and fair credit billing that allows users to stop payment on fraudulent purchases.

Debit cards are governed by the law known as the Electronic Fund Transfer Act. You are not liable for charges IF you report the loss or theft of your debit card to your bank immediately AND it has not been used. If you notify the bank within two days, you are liable for up to \$50. On day three, your liability becomes \$500. If sixty days pass and you haven't notified the bank, absent extenuating circumstances, you can kiss all that money goodbye even if it came from another account linked to the one you access with your debit card.

U.S. Public Interest Research Group (U.S. PIRG) is urging Congress to make protection for all "plastic" equal.
