Grounds Update

Franconia Road has a new row of Arbovite Green Giants set back far enough as not to encroach on the sidewalk

Several felled or dead trees were removed as well as the row of diseased bushes across from the tennis courts.

The County is working on the culvert on the trail that needs serious work after damage from heavy rains. The County has accepted responsibility for the culvert behind the Ridge View tot lot.

Ridge View pet waste can was replaced and you will soon see a bench on Medallion and the tennis court area will get a new bench and trash can.

Ridge View Paving Update

Ridge View, from Franconia to the circle, is included in a VDOT contract ending July 2016. If the work starts this fall, we are a priority and could see crews on-site in early October. We have been assured the speed humps and street markings will not be affected.

VDOT reports that the area where Ridge View intersects at the circle (end of VDOT property) and starts up the hill (Association road) has a standard crown to avoid the area holding water.


DEER HUNT IN LOFTRIDGE PARK

From Sept 12, 2015 to Feb 20, 2016, archers will be permitted to hunt in Loftridge and Clermont Parks Mondays thru Saturdays beginning 30 minutes prior to sunrise until 30 minutes past sunset.

Hunting is conducted from elevated tree stands ensuring all arrows are at a downward angle. The stands are located at least 100 feet from the park property lines and 50 feet from established park trails. Archers will wear program identification, have attended safety training and demonstrated superior marksmanship before licensing.

The deer population in Fairfax County has grown to a level that poses hazards and is not sustainable over time. There are thousands of deer-vehicle collisions that result in injury and death of residents. Deer are the primary hosts for ticks that cause Lyme disease. Over-browsing by deer impacts the ecosystem including loss of other wildlife species that depend on these habitats for food, cover and nest/den sites.

The Fairfax County Deer Management Program is a cooperative effort of the Fairfax County Police Department and Park Authority.



Franconia Road's "Diet Lanes"

This fall Franconia Road will see drastic changes from Van Dorn to Mark Twain MS. The existing four lanes will become a bike lane, an eastbound lane, a turn lane, a westbound lane and a bike lane.

Preventing Larcenies from Vehicles

While there is no guaranteed method of preventing theft:

- Keep your car doors locked.
- Don't leave valuables, such as money, purses, or cell phones in your vehicle.
- Belongings left in the car regularly should be stored out of sight (in the trunk, glove box or console).
- At night, leave your porch light on!! It's a cheap deterrent.



Distracted Walking



It's not safe to walk while using a cellphone. One study of 11,000 unintended injuries revealed 25% broken or dislocated bones, 24% strains or sprains and 23% had concussions or contusions.

Unintended injuries are the 5th leading cause of death after heart disease, cancer, respiratory disease and stroke!! And 26% of vehicle accidents involve the driver talking on a cell phone or texting.

Fall Planting Tips

Early fall is the best time for planting after you have removed all the leaves, weeds and debris from area. Shrubs and trees will establish root systems over the winter. Plant those perennials and for more blooms next year, divide those that need it - - after they are done blooming. Simply cut them back if too young to divide. Winter hardy pansies and violas planted now, will bloom this fall and again in the spring, and those spring blooming bulbs can be planted as long as the ground isn't frozen. Finally don't forget to mulch for cold weather protection.

Pedestrian Safety

October is the month with the highest pedestrian involved incidents. According to local police, it is a <u>myth</u> that "pedestrians always have the right-of-way."

Many jurisdictions have begun pedestrian safety initiatives to encourage drivers and walkers to be more aware of surroundings. No one intends to get run over!!

Empty or Expired Fire Extinguishers

Smoke Detector Safety

The majority of fatalities occur while occupants are asleep. Contrary to popular belief, the smell of smoke may not wake you up. So consider:

- a smoke alarm on every level and if your bedroom door is shut, put one in the bedroom
- test alarms monthly and replace the battery at first "chirping sound" but at a minimum replace batteries annually
- vacuum around smoke alarms. Dust and debris can interfere with operation

smoke alarms wear out and

should be replaced every ten years. Get a battery back-up for wired-in smoke detectors so they will function in case of loss of power
